The Super Saturday Program is an enrichment program for intellectually gifted children, ages 4-14, in the Greater Cincinnati area. Starting in the Fall of 1981, The Super Saturday Program has grown from serving a handful of gifted children at the University of Cincinnati's main campus to serving hundreds of children each session, now on Walnut Hills High School campus.

At The Super Saturday Program, children can explore established and new areas of interest while surrounded by their gifted peers. Classes are held six Saturdays each fall, winter, and spring, with both morning and afternoon classes.

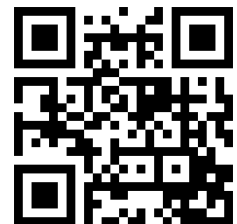

A Variety of Classes

Class offerings vary from term to term and will be available on our website a few days prior to registration opening. Here is a sample listing of classes which we have offered in the past.

Art Through the Ages

Come and explore our human experience through Art. We will recreate works of art using many of the techniques and styles from the dawn of civilization to the present day. From ancient Egyptian wall paintings to Greek mosaics, coats of arms from the middle ages to the glorious renaissance and beyond, see what wonders you can create.

Chemical Explorations

Come measure, pour, mix and swirl into the world of chemistry as we explore reactions that make sidewalk chalk, ice cream, crystals and much more. Meet the Clancy's, make density bottles and make water flow uphill in this hands on, educational and fun session.

Elementary, My Dear Shakespeare

Julius Caesar: military hero and servant of Rome or overly ambitious dictator? Come perform Shakespeare's powerful play of the murder of Rome's most famous ruler; filled with incredible characters and speeches, there will be fun and excitement for all! 'Et tu, Brute?'

Jr CSI

Jr CSI introduces the students to Forensic Science. Students will use techniques to solve crimes, and explore how law and science are used to solve cases. Forensic Science topics such as Forensic Odontology, Forensic Toxicology, Trace Evidence, and Questioned Documents will be explored.

Lost Civilizations

A class for young explorers to explore archaeological sites around the globe. Go on a journey to archaeological sites in six different regions around the world including: Egypt, China, Petra, the Levant, Mexico and the South Pacific. Classes are full of hands-on fun and take-home projects. So pack your bags and let's go exploring!

Make a Microprocessor Controlled Robot

Build a microprocessor controlled robot. The class is designed to introduce the student to microprocessors, computer programming, electronic sensors, and robotics by building a toy robot that is programmed to follow a line and respond to motion. Introduction to computer programming and microprocessor architecture will be taught.
