#### Little Miami Local School District Online Survey Results November 1 - 8, 2016

The following are the results of the online survey conducted from Tuesday, November 1, 2016 through Tuesday, November 08, 2016. The online survey was a follow-up to the Little Miami local School District Community Meeting held on November 1, 2016 which was part of the process to develop its Facility Master Plan. A total of 1,099 people completed the online version of the survey addressing a series of questions regarding academics, facilities, and other topics for Little Miami Schools. The questions were designed to collect and prioritize the community's desires for educating the children of the Little Miami Local School District.

Please note that the survey is not intended to be a scientific study. The results only represent the total number of attendee responses to each question. Some attendees choose not to respond to all questions. Therefore, the total number of responses varies by question. In addition, there are some questions involving prioritizing which allowed respondents to provide more than one response to a question. As a result, percentages for some questions may exceed one hundred percent.
