Registration Gateway

Little Miami uses Registration Gateway to maintain student contact and emergency information.

Help Us Grow Our Readers

Welcome back to school readers! Now that we are settling into our routines here at school, we hope you are at home as well. One of your nightly routines should be reading! Your student should be reading to you, and don't forget to read to your student as well!

Your student should be bringing home a book, or books, each night that are at a "good fit" level. This means that they should be able to read most of the book on their own, with just a little bit of help from you. Our readers will only grow as readers, if they practice reading on a consistent basis. While students have opportunities to read at school, there are tremendous benefits for students who engage in nightly reading with a parent, guardian, or more advanced reader. Research has shown that children who read each night will become better readers more quickly, become more fluent, become better writers, and have increased oral communication skills than children who do not read consistently.

Lastly, do not skip reading to your child! Children reap huge benefits, such as increased vocabulary and fluency, from listening to fluent readers read more challenging books, which they are not able to read quite yet. Consider having your student read their books during homework time, and then reading aloud to your student before bed. Children are also motivated to become better readers when they are exposed to new and exciting books! We thank you for your partnership in providing consistent time and space for nightly reading!



I am so excited to be the library/media specialist for Grades One and Two, as reading and literacy are my passion! My goal is to inspire a love of reading that will last a lifetime! I truly believe that if a child doesn't like to read, they simply haven't found the right book yet.

We have been very busy in the library learning the routines, procedures, and rules for optimal learning. Ask your child to share our "Hug Your Books" line-up song we sing when leaving the library.

We began the year with many visual props to help the students relate to the types of books in the library (clown nose = funny, joke books; magic wand = fantasy/fiction, and "Al" the alligator hand-puppet to demonstrate non-fiction/animal books).

"Dr. Evil" visited to teach us about what NOT to do with our books (including spilling fruit punch and performing a surgery on a book bought by Mrs. Carmack used for demonstration purposes only), as we delved into proper book care in preparation for library check-out which will begin as soon as we have all of our Type to Learn accounts set-up. Let's encourage our young readers to be responsible by caring for their books and returning them on time.

Another aspect of my job is teaching keyboarding. I will use a program called Type to Learn Cloud.

Why teach keyboarding? Computing is a way of life today. Not only in school or in the workforce, but also as a means for communicating with others, sharing ideas, and expressing thoughts. The keyboard is the primary means of interfacing with a computer. Keyboarding is therefore an essential, 21st Century skill that students must develop in order to use computers effectively and efficiently.

Even very young children are actively involved with using technology and computers on a regular basis. Research shows that keyboarding is and should be taught to students at an earlier age, before bad habits form. This early introduction reduces bad habit development and provides additional benefits that include improvements in spelling, writing, and reading comprehension. Student writing develops faster through word processing because it facilitates the review and revision process. Efficient keyboarding skills allow students to emphasize concept development instead of focusing on key location. Students who become efficient keyboarders "compose better, are prouder of their work, produce documents with a neater appearance, and have better motivation," (Nieman, 1996). Language arts skills are further developed by the lessons and activities in Type to Learn, which reinforce phonics, grammar, vocabulary, proper usage of punctuation, sight words, frequently misspelled words, and other elements of written language. Cross-curricular activity payoffs provide grade-appropriate incidental learning in science, literature, social studies, and other general knowledge topics. Mastering keyboarding involves learning technique (physical positioning and movement), ergonomics (safe and comfortable keyboard interaction), and key location.

With Type to Learn, using the keyboard will become as natural to your students as writing with pen and paper. Its research-based, interactive learning environment will engage all K-12 keyboarding learners.

After your child's Type to Learn accounts have been created, I will be sending home instructions on how to log in to this program at home so they can further advance their skills at home, as well as at school.

I truly believe that reading gives our brains superpowers! I can't wait to watch all our young superheroes grow this year!



Accelerated Reader

Accelerated Reader is a computer program that helps teachers and librarians manage and monitor children's independent reading practice. Your child picks a book at his own level and reads it at his own pace. When finished, your child takes a short quiz on the computer.

Students at Maineville are earning charms for every 5 points they earn. Students earn points by reading books at their level and taking a computerized test about that book. At the end of each week, students who have earned 5 points are recognized for their reading success. Their names are announced over the intercom each week. Charms are in 5 point increments up to 100. After 100, charms are in 25 point increments.

In addition, classrooms earn points for rewards too. We have a school-wide contest each quarter. The class that earns the most points each quarter will get a pizza party! The next time you are at school, check out the Lego Board. Classes are putting up Legos as they earn points. We are truly building better readers!

The student's are very excited about this reading program! Ask your student about Accelerated Reader!

A Note from the Nurse



Dear Parents,

My name is Amy McReynolds, and I am the nurse at Hamilton-Maineville Primary. I am available every day, during school hours, to assist your child with any health needs.

As we enter the cold & flu season, it's important to work together to decrease the spread of illness. The following suggestions will help you determine when your child should **not** attend school:

*If your child has a fever of 100 degrees or above the previous evening or that morning. Your child must be fever free (without medication) for 24 hours before returning to school.

*If your child has experienced vomiting or diarrhea during the night or that morning.

Prevention is the best intervention!

Please remind your child of the importance of good hand washing, getting enough rest and adequate fluid intake. Feel free to contact me with questions/concerns, or any special healthcare needs that your child may have. I am looking forward to caring for this wonderful group of 1st and 2nd graders!

My name is Brittany Stultz and I am your child's school counselor! School counselors work with all students to help support them with academic development, career exploration and social/emotional development.

There are three main ways that I work with students:

- Classroom Guidance Lessons: I spend time with your child's class, teaching them a specific skill or focusing on a certain topic.
- Small Group Counseling: I work with students in groups of 6-8 to focus on a common topic/skill. (A small group sign up form was sent home on August 25. If you have any interest in your child joining a small group, please complete the form and return it to school.)
- Individual Counseling: One-on-one meetings that are short term to help support them with their needs. Outside referrals are made if further services are needed.

During the last two weeks of August, I went into each first and second grade classroom to introduce myself by reading the book "Mrs. Joyce Gives the Best High Fives" and had a "minute meeting" with each student. During these meetings, I had the wonderful opportunity of meeting each student individually in our school.
