2022-2023 School Profile

Community Information:

Situated 30 miles Northeast of Cincinnati and spanning 98 square miles, The Little Miami school district is comprised of both rural and suburban areas and encompasses the communities of: Morrow, Maineville, Butlerville, Hamilton Township, Harlan Township, and Salem Township. Little Miami has grown to encompass five buildings and more than 5,000 students for the 2022-2023 school year, an all-time high. The district prides itself on child-centered decision-making, service to the whole child, and opportunities for all students to achieve at their highest.

School Information:

Little Miami High School (CEEBS Code 363515) is a four-year comprehensive high school with a student enrollment of 1,600 in grades 9-12 (127 attend WCCC) and 85 full-time faculty. 88% of the student body is Caucasian, 4% African-American 3% is 2 or more races, 3% Hispanic/Latino, and 2% Asian. Juniors and seniors may receive specialized vocational training by attending the Warren County Career Center in Lebanon, Ohio. Little Miami is accredited by the North Central Association of Secondary Schools, Ohio Department of Education, and High Schools That Work.

Curriculum:

Little Miami High School operates on a traditional semester calendar with 7 periods throughout the school day. The following 11 AP classes are offered at Little Miami High School: English Literature, U.S. Government, U.S. History, World History, European History, French, Spanish, Calculus AB, Statistics, Biology, and Chemistry. Honors classes are offered in: English 9, English 10, English 11, Chemistry, Biology, Anatomy & Physiology, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus/Trigonometry, Physics, World History, and American History.

Grading Scale: Letter grades (A, B, C, D, & F) are used in reporting student progress. Points awarded are as follows: 4 A (100-90) 3 B (89-80) 2 C (79-70) 1 D (69-60) 0 F (59-0)

Weighted Courses: Honors Courses and Advanced Placement Courses. Students earning credit for a weighted course will receive a .05 "add-on" factor, to be added to their cumulative grade point average upon successful completion of each weighted course per semester.

Graduation Requirements: Students must complete 20 Credits in the following content areas in order to be eligible for graduation: 4 English, 4 Math, 3 Science, 3 Social Studies, 1 PE/Health, 1 Fine Art, and 4 elective credits. Students must also complete 12 hours of community service and earn a competency score on the Algebra 1 and ELA 2 Ohio State Tests or a remediation free score on a national college admission test, and earn 2 college/career state readiness seals in 2 areas of the 12 seals that are available. *Please refer to page 3*

Class of 2022:

There were 355 graduates in the class of 2022.

- 155 students earned a 4.0 or higher
- 52 students earned between a 3.5 & 3.99
- 56 students earned between a 3.0 & 3.49
- 41 students earned between a 2.5 & 2.99
- 25 students earned between a 2.0 & 2.49
- 26 students earned below a 2.0

Graduates attending college: 80%

- Four Year Institutions 57%
- Two Year Institutions 23%
- Military Enlistment 2%
- Other (Work, Apprenticeship, Gap Year) 18%

82% of the graduates will attend college in Ohio while 18% will attend college out of state.

Little Miami's class of 2022 had 4 National Merit Finalists.

Standardized Testing:

Every student is required to take the ACT in the State of Ohio. The Class of 2021 had scores ranging from 11-35, with the average composite score being 21.7

In 2022, 207 students took 318 AP Tests in 10 subject areas with the average score being 3.3
78% of all AP exams received a 3 or higher.

Awards & Distinctions:

- Ranked #71 out of 916 High Schools in Ohio and in the top 8% nationally by US News & Report.
- Little Miami was named to the AP Honor Roll.
- 1 of 35 High Schools given the Momentum Award for exceeding student growth & achievement in Ohio.
- Received the High Schools that Work Pacesetter Award.

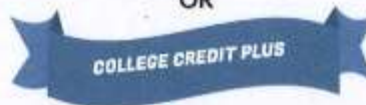
